



¹Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy,


To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace.

²We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly ³remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, 5 because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, 7so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. ⁸For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, ¹⁰ and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.



APOSTLES' CREED


I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.





Dear members of the Trinity Lutheran Church Congregation,

Currently the church council is concerned with Trinity's cash flow. September was the lowest offering month for Trinity over the last four years. Our general offerings, those not designated for special projects, are not keeping up with our normal monthly operating expenses. Those expenses include worship supplies, youth ministry, utilities, insurance, custodial expenses, salaries, fellowship, etc.

The past three years of our church's journey has been filled with challenges and new beginnings: The remodel of the Gruver room, the COVID-19 Pandemic, the recently completed renovation of the Rohr Fellowship Hall, and our increased focus on providing ministry not just inside of the church walls but into our communities both far and wide. All of these have provided us with excellent opportunities to share our gifts and blessings with new friends and old.

The consistent and supportive giving of our members has allowed the Trinity Council to make 2023 our year of refocusing, of planning what the future of Trinity holds and what opportunities may have been overlooked. We are looking forward to telling our story as People of God and the people of Trinity. This process includes evaluating our facilities, our ministries, and of course our finances.

Trinity's church council wanted to bring this to your attention as we are navigating options to manage ministry funding. Ministry at Trinity is something that takes all of us to support. Our mission is to engage the world with God's grace, and with your generosity we continue to support the mission before us.
