

FIRST READING: Jonah 2:1-10

¹Then Jonah prayed to the LORD his God from the belly of the fish, ²saying,

"I called to the Lord out of my distress, and he answered me; out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and you heard my voice.

3 You cast me into the deep, into the heart of the seas, and the flood surrounded me;

all your waves and your billows passed over me.

⁴ Then I said, 'I am driven away from your sight;

how shall I look again upon your holy temple?'

⁵ The waters closed in over me; the deep surrounded me;

weeds were wrapped around my head

at the roots of the mountains.

I went down to the land whose bars closed upon me forever; yet you brought up my life from the Pit, O Lord my God.

⁷ As my life was ebbing away, I remembered the Lord, and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple.

Hope in God, for I shall again praise him, my help and my God.


SECOND READING: Romans 8:31-39

³¹What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³²He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace, and may say, "Peace be with you," or similar words.


