



#### **SECOND READING: 2 Timothy 1:1-14**

<sup>1</sup>Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus,

<sup>2</sup>To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

<sup>3</sup>I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. <sup>4</sup>Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. <sup>5</sup>I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. <sup>6</sup>For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; <sup>7</sup>for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

<sup>8</sup>Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, <sup>9</sup>who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, <sup>10</sup>but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. <sup>11</sup>For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, <sup>12</sup>and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. <sup>13</sup>Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. <sup>14</sup>Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.



Dearest Members of Trinity,

"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
(1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

At three services this spring, Council members Martin Greller, Randy Wilkison, and I shared information with you about the financial position of Trinity and highlighted some of the Council's work. As your Council, we are excited to provide you with an update as we enter into the fall season.

Every week, through offerings, we come together to support the life of our Church and our faith in God. For many years, Trinity has had a consistent pattern of falling short with our offerings from time to time throughout the year. In April, we were \$7,000 short of what we needed in income to meet monthly expenses. As a Council, we asked each of you to faithfully consider your ability to give to Trinity; thank you for considering and responding to our call. As of the September Council financial statement, we are \$15,475 in the black and, at this point in time, we anticipate to be in a position to carry over funds into 2020.

Your commitment to grow our ministry in service to God is deeply appreciated.

Trinity has also been blessed with the hire of Linda Lebeda as the new Finance Director. Linda worked as a CPA in Laramie for many years and is excited to share her vocational gifts with Trinity. If you would like an accounting of your contributions at any point in time, please connect with Linda and she will be happy to provide you with your records. Linda can be reached by email (telc.finance.director@gmail.com) or by calling the Church office (307-745-4222). And, if you are not receiving an electronic receipt each time you give to Trinity through offerings, please provide the Church office with your email address and these will be sent to you on a regular basis.

We are continuing work on the constitution by reviewing our current documents and revising them to be consistent with the national constitution. Our goal is to present a draft constitution at the annual meeting which is scheduled for January 26, 2020. If you are interested in assisting the Council with the revision process, please connect with the Church office to let them know of your interest.

Other projects slated to begin this fall include work to improve the drainage on the south side of the Church property and the development of fiscal policies and procedures. And you have all witnessed the transformation of the Gruver Room over the last year. Thank you for coming together in so many beautiful ways to give new life to this gathering space.

It's with deep gratitude that the Council serves Trinity. We are always open to your feedback, suggestions, and vision for our faith community. We look forward to the next chapters of our collective story in Christ's name.
