mourning and crying and pain will be no more,



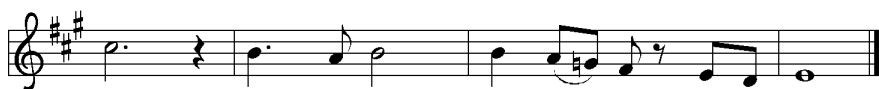
